• A treatment for solid waste
• Reduces volume by 80%
• Reduces weight by 90%

• Reduces odour
• Reduces leachate
• Reduces fly-tipping

• Reduces risk of fire
• Reduces risk of flooding
• Reduces risk of disease

• Reduces risk of pollution
• Reduces risk of contamination
• Reduces risk of environmental damage

• Reduces risk of health problems
• Reduces risk of death
• Reduces risk of injury


Road/Landing Maintenance

- Distribute slash across landing and replant if abandoning
- Monitor for erosion (water bars, drivable dips)
- Repair road depending on damage
- Abandon temporary roads
- Annually maintain permanent roads
- Monitor drainage systems

- Seedlings (natural regeneration or additional planting)
- Forest health
- Wildlife activity & habitat development
- Invasive species
- Timber growth



EQIP & CSP

Farm Bill funding for rural landowners

- Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)
 - Provides 50% - 75% of cost for:
 - Forest management plans
 - Conservation practices
- Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)
 - Supports “good stewardship practices”
 - Provides \$1,500 annual “base payment” for 5-year contract, plus
 - Smaller additional incentive payments for specific conservation practices



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
